Continuation of MATH 1300. Topics include transcendental functions, methods of integration, polar coordinates, conic sections, improper integrals, and infinite series. Prereq., Calculus 1. Credit not granted for this course and MATH 1320 or APPM 1360. We intend to cover sections 1.8, 6.9, 7.4, 7.9, 8.2-8.6, 8.8, 9.1, 9.3, 9.4, chapter 10, and sections 11.1-11.3 of the book.

Grading

- * Homeworks/Quizzes/Presentations: 150 points;
- * Three Midterms: 300 (= 3 times 100) points;
- * Final Exam: 200 points.
